HOW TO ENTER

- 1 Complete the entry form in the schedule and return it by the due date.
- 2 All exhibits, including the flower show and Shepton in Bloom exhibits to be set up in the marquee at the Mid Somerset Showground between 8.30am - 1.30pm on Saturday 15th August.
- 3 Children may enter all classes but only the children's section will be judged taking age into account. PLEASE STATE child's age on Entry Form.
- 4 Judging will commence at 2.30pm on Saturday 15th August. Only Judges and Officials will be permitted in the marquee from then until the Show is opened to the public at 9.30am on Sunday 16th August.
- 5 Exhibits to be bona fide property of and cultivated by the exhibitor (excepting floral art or children's section).
- 6 Class cards will be provided. Please collect before staging.
- 7 While every reasonable care will be taken the Show Committee cannot take responsibility for loss or damage to exhibits.
- 8 Any objection must be made in writing and handed to the Chief Steward before 2.30pm on the Show Day.
- 9 The Committee shall have the power to decide all matters not provided for in these Rules and on all matters on which there is any question. Their decision is final.
- 10 All exhibits must remain in the show tent until 5.00pm.
- 11 Judges may withhold prizes where there are insufficient entries.
- 12 Cups and trophies will be presented at 4.30pm in the marquee.
- 13 Cups and trophies will remain the property of Mid-Somerset Show Committee.

- 1 All Exhibits are staged at the sole risk of the exhibitor
- 2 Prizes may be reduced at the discretion of the Judge
- 3 A Class may be cancelled / amalgamated if there are insufficient entries
- 4 The Judges decision is final
- 5 Exhibitors, when completing the entry form, must agree to the rules, regulations and conditions of the Society
- 6 Each exhibit must be listed on the correct entry form provided by the Show Secretary. The completed form must reach the Show Secretary by Friday 31st July 2009, accompanied by the correct fee.
- 7 Each exhibit entered at the show must be clearly identified by the number specifically allocated by the Secretary for that exhibit. The duplicate ticket is to be retained by the exhibitor for the collection at the end of the show.
- 8 Each exhibit is to be the work of the exhibitor and must be entered in his/her name. No exhibit that has previously won a prize at the Mid-Somerset Show can be entered.
- 9 An exhibit may be entered in only one class
- 10 No advertising matter can be staged with any exhibit
- 11 An exhibit can only be handled by Show officials between the times of staging and its time of removal.
- 12 Disposal of any exhibits remaining after 6.00pm will be at the discretion of the Chief Steward.
- 13 Prize money must be collected at the Show Secretaries' Marquee between 4.45pm and 6.00pm on show day. Any prize money not collected on the day will be forfeited.
- 14 The duplicate number must be shown to the Chief Steward when a prize is removed.
- 15 The Childrens' section is open to children aged 16years and under on the day of the show, except where otherwise stated. The age of the exhibitor must be stated on the entry form and on the allocated number that identifies/corresponds with the exhibit
